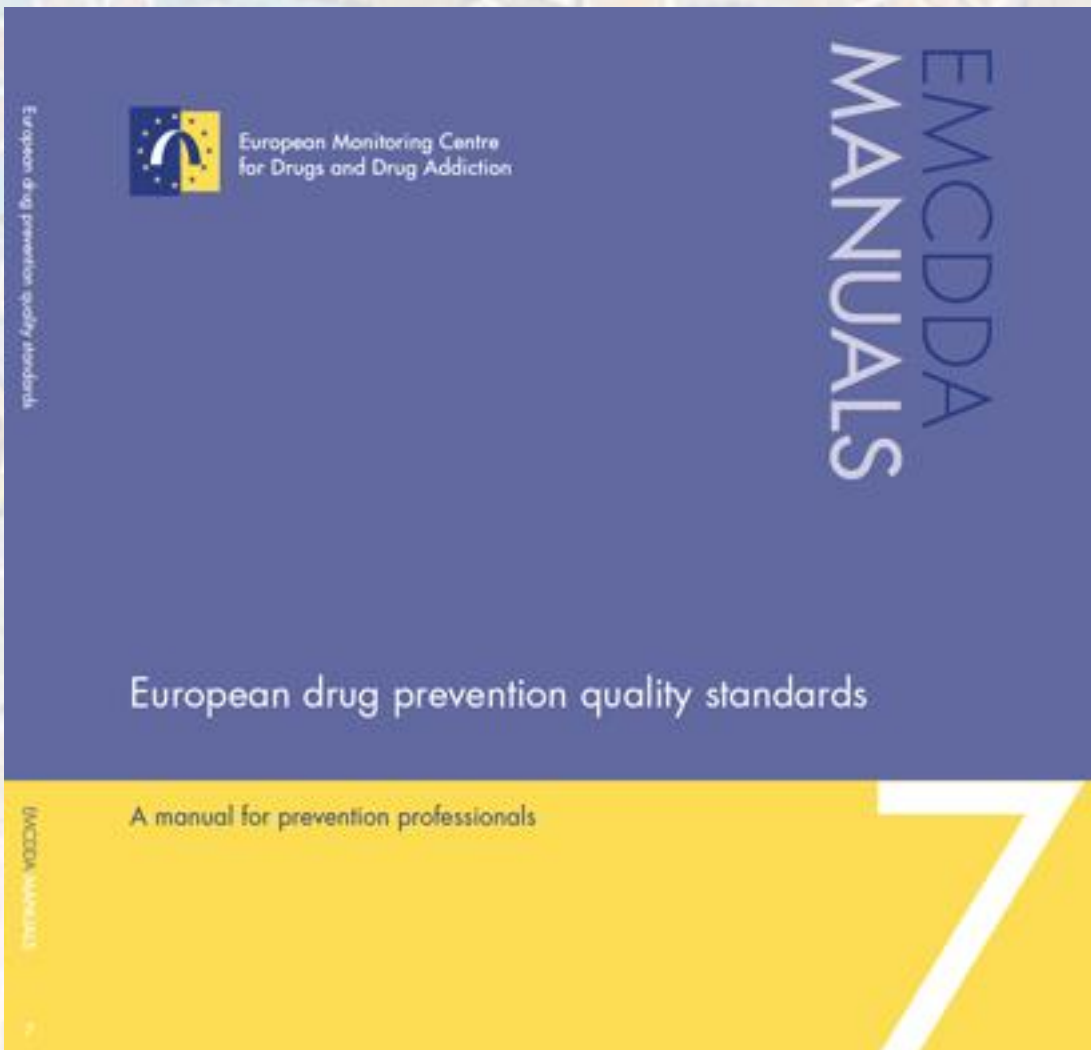

to intended users





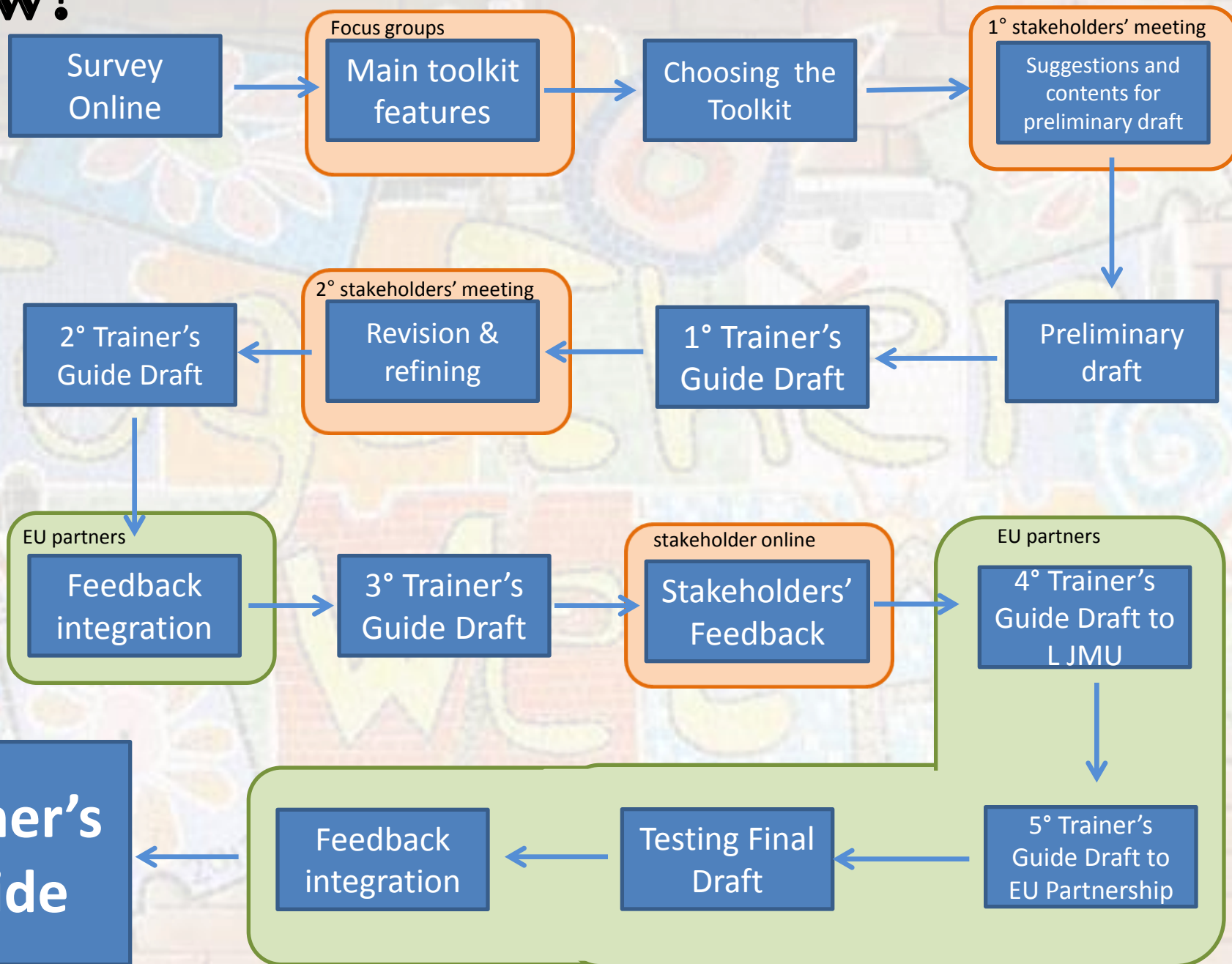

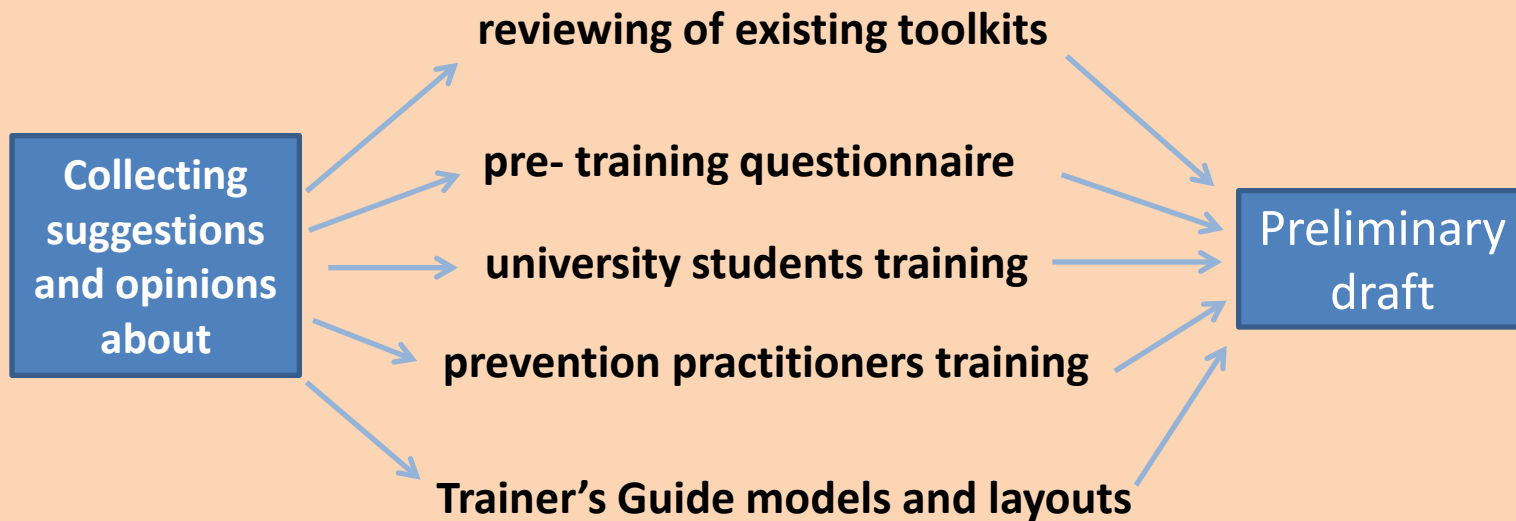


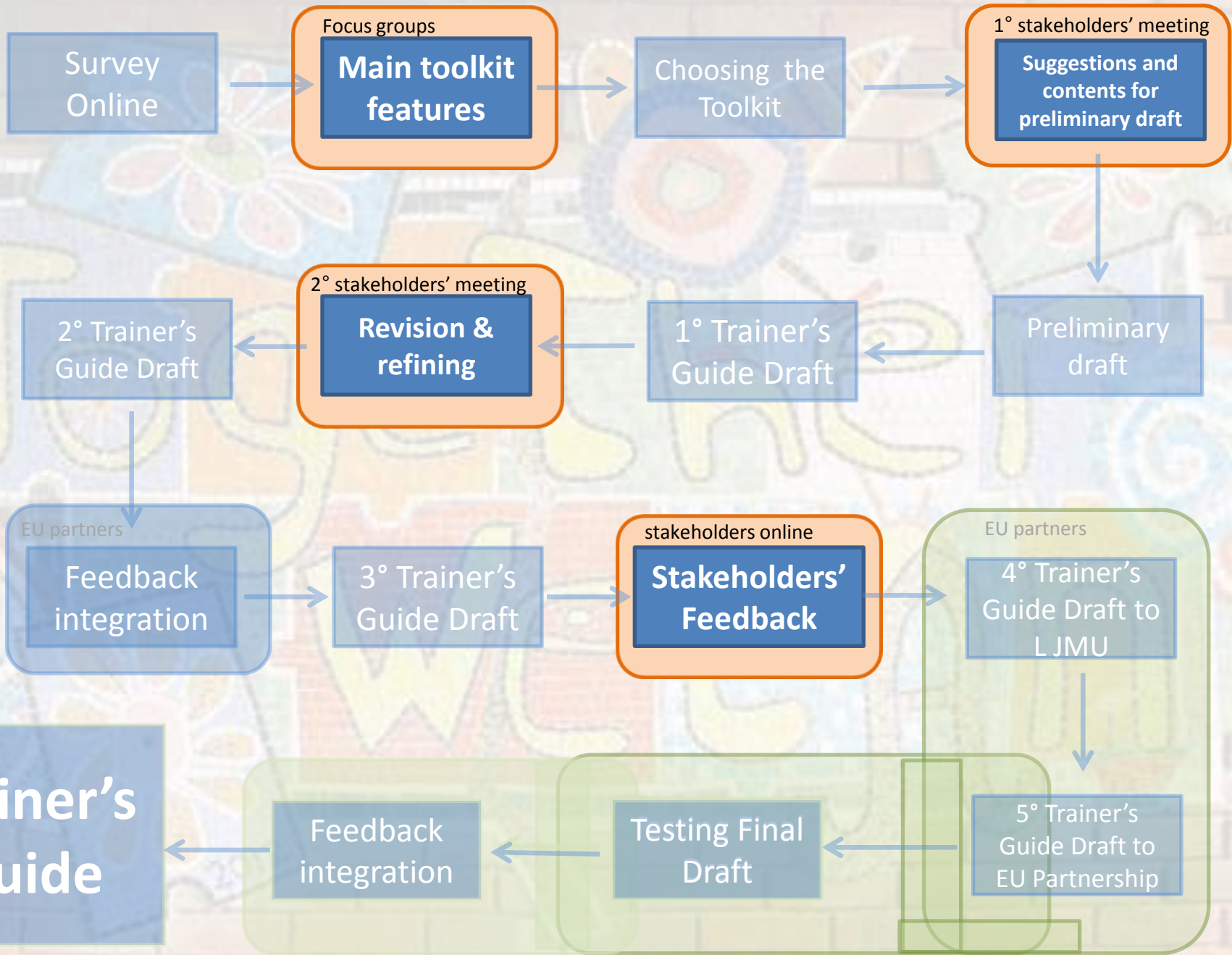


# Stakeholders involvement



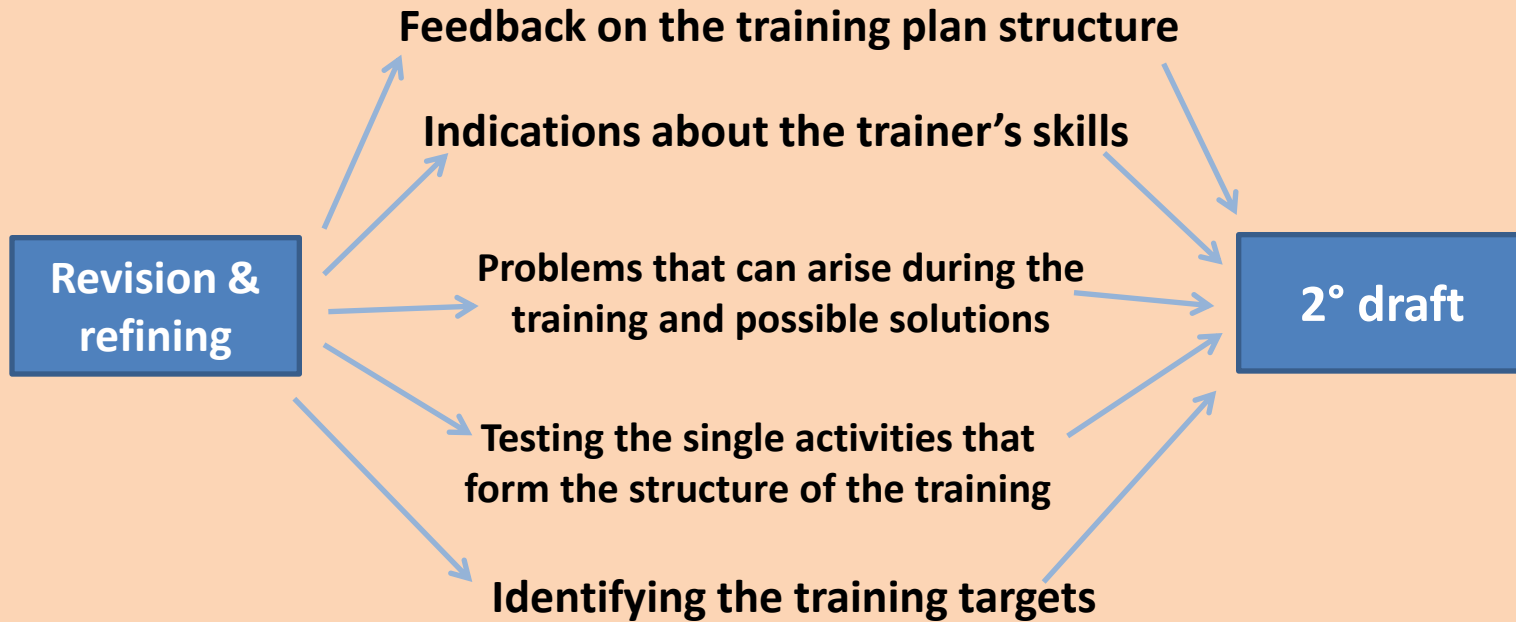
1° stakeholders' meeting

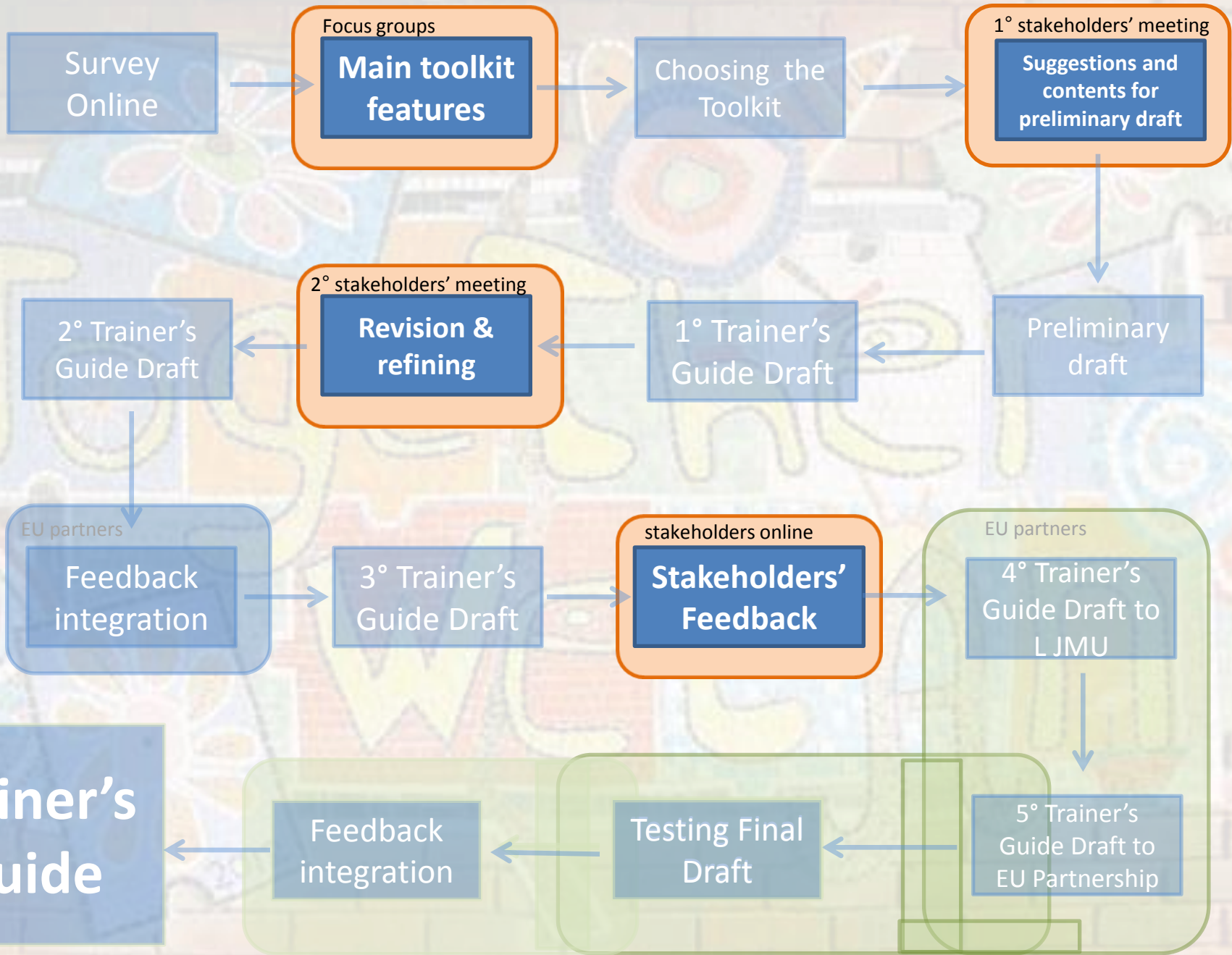






2° stakeholders' meeting





# So...

- ❖ This kind of process requires a highly motivated and coordinated **local project group** , and good working **relationships** with the stakeholders
- ❖ It's a **time consuming** process
- ❖ Stakeholders are considered actors of a **collaborative authorship** and need to be **empowered** in their skills
- ❖ It requires giving up the **role of "expert "**

# ...but

- ❖ Target groups active involvement contribute to build a more **representative** guide that combines different needs and perspectives
- ❖ It ensures a more **user-friendly** approach
- ❖ It contributes to developing a sense of **ownership** of the guide
- ❖ It facilitates the use and **dissemination** of the guide
